Who May Participate

Elbert County High School students may participate in the Juneteenth Art Contest.

Materials

- 1) The Art Contest is designed to showcase hand-drawn or hand-painted art on a paper surface or canvas.
- 2) Paper collage, fabric, yarn, etc., may be added to the primary drawing. However, it should not extend significantly beyond the paper surface and should not add weight to the art piece, making it impossible to display.
- 3) At least 75% of the work must be done with crayons, markers, ink, pencil, pastels, oils, acrylics, watercolor, or a combination.

Concepts

Your art must be your original concept and not a copy of anyone else's copyrighted material.

You may only submit the artwork that you created.

How to Submit

- 1) An information card with your contact information should be securely attached to the back of your artwork.
- 2) A Jim-Ree African American Museum member will pick up your entry from your school.
